The NIGF meetings which are held annually in a multi-stakeholder format serves as preparatory forum where all the stakeholders convene and discuss pertinent Internet Governance policies and development issues.

These efforts serves to achieve a harmonization of the Nigerian position in the Regional and Global Internet Governance Forum, which this year, will be taking place at João Pessoa, Brazil, from November 10th -13th, 2015.

It is our, sincere, hope that at the end of the discussions and deliberations, we would have a clear position on what actions we need to take and how it should be done to achieve our overall objective of harnessing the potentials of

Internet governance multi-stakeholder process towards enabling sustainable development goals in the country.
